- Presenting the fundamental principles governing the conclusion of commercial contracts.

Objectives for the unit: "Understanding the EU": introduction to EU law and institutions

The overall objective of the Unit is to develop understanding about the functioning of the EU (law and institutions) and its importance for "doing business" in and with European partners.

- Presenting the main economic and commercial rules which define the business environment in the EU.
